Class Teacher

In the first instance you should ask your child's class teacher about queries such as homework, school work, friendships or progress matters



Middle Leadership Team

Assistant Headteacher

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PE:Tuesday afternoon and Wednesday morning/afternoon

- Children must bring their kit into school on a Monday and take it home on a Friday.
- Please ensure that the P.E kit is returned the following day if your child takes it home after an after-school club E.g. football or netball
- Children may bring in trainers for outdoor lessons, but they must also bring a pair of black plimsolls.
- Children must bring in full P.E kit: CC t-shirt/polo, navy shorts and plimsolls.
- Children may also bring in, alongside their PE kit, the CC navy tracksuit. (Please do not send in a tracksuit as an alternative.)
- If your child does not bring in their P.E kit, we will phone to give you the option to bring it into school. Failing that, we do not provide spare P.E. kits and your child will miss their P.E. lesson (health and safety).



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Swimming:

Swimming takes place on a Thursday and the children return to school at 3.30pm. The Lower Junior classes will be swimming at the following times:

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Homework

- Homework is set on Thursdays with the aim to be completed by the following Tuesday.
- It may be an online homework (Mathletics, TimeTables Rockstars, Spag.com) or a worksheet(s).
- English homework will usually be a grammar focus or a reading/comprehension-based activity.
- Maths will either be an online activity set by the teacher or an activity that focuses on areas we feel pupils need to develop at home.
- We will sometimes inform parents about homework by email if required.
- Weekly spellings.
- One school reading book a week.

Class Talk

- Each child will be given the opportunity to present a 'Class Talk' to their peers once this year.
- The children can choose a topic of interest to them or share their talent or hobby.
- Dates will be sent out for the year so you will know when your child has their talk.
- If you choose to create a Power Point presentation, please email it to the class teacher. We cannot accept presentations sent into school on a USB stick.
- We do not expect the presentation to be longer than 5 minutes.



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Curriculum Enrichment:

- We organise a variety of educational visits throughout the year which relate to the topics the children are studying in school. If a packed lunch is required, please ensure it is placed within a reusable bag with your child's name clearly marked on it. Please note, **nut products are not permitted within school.**
- Children are expected to wear full uniform unless otherwise stated; school hats and blazers are essential.
- We encourage parents to join us on educational visits when possible. Where places are limited, we will allocate these equitably as possible and we will try to offer as many parents as possible the opportunity to join us on at least one school trip during the year. If you are able to join us on a school trip, please make sure you are aware of our parent's guidance for accompanying us on a school trip.
- To enhance the children's learning, we also invite visitors and theatre companies into school at certain times throughout the year. Parents are invited and encouraged to come into school to share any expertise or experiences they have which are related to our topics.
